

## Psychology Internships

Students are advised to check site websites for further information about these sites. While efforts are made to keep this information updated, sites may change contact information (phone numbers and addresses, as well as staff). When reviewing the websites, look for pages described as “getting involved,” or “volunteering,” or “internships.” Find names, phone numbers and emails of staff associated with these programs. If you can’t find that information on the webpages, you might also call the main number of the site and ask a receptionist for information about someone who might supervise a college intern at their site. While most of the sites below are focused on counseling or other human service sites, the Center for Career and Calling has sites that involve Human Resources work as well.
